Answer: Explore Australia

Answer: Hockey players

Answer: Explore Australia

8. Which of the following is NOT a dinosaur: Triceratops, Narwhal, or Brontosaurus?

Answer: Narwhal is a whale **Britannica School Edition**

9. What color are the spots on the outer edges of a monarch butterfly's wings?

Answer: Black, **Searchasaurus**

10. Some books about dinosaurs are made up stories. Some books about dinosaurs are true. How can you tell the difference in **Novelist K-8 Plus**?

Answer: Says non-fiction or fiction in each entry

Answer: Find answers in Genre children's poetry, search Maine

13. Using the Searchasaurus dictionary can you tell us how many legs an insect has?

Answer: Yes. Any of a large group of animals that have six legs, a body with three main divisions, and usually wings. Flies, bees, grasshoppers, butterflies, and moths are insects.

14. Kids come up with clever solutions to problems every day! Can you tell us about a recent invention by a young person? **Searchasaurus**, hard but found one.

15. What is your favorite book on the Must-read Classics for Grades K-2 book list in **Novelist K-8 Plus**?

Answer: Change age to young readers search classics
